'In 1925, aboard the [SS Finland](#), [Harold Vanderbilt](#) play tested his version of [Contract Bridge](#), which used the same rules as Auction Bridge for the bidding and play but featured completely new scoring tables. After quickly becoming popular in Southampton and Newport, Vanderbilt's Contract Bridge was adopted by the Whist Club Of New York in 1927 and the Portland Club in 1929; by the end of 1929 it was the only bridge game being played in the clubs of NY and London.

As we see from this note in *Wikipedia*, last year's 'Champagne Regional' marked the centennial of our beloved game. Many of us who play duplicate bridge today owe at least a nod to Harold Vanderbilt (yes, of the noses-in-the-air Vanderbilt family) for inaugurating the modern version of bridge. So this year, we would propose our regionals 'champagne toast' in honor of such fabled aristocrats as Mr. Vanderbilt, who made contract bridge, and later duplicate bridge, a game for all of us. Let's lift our glasses!
